

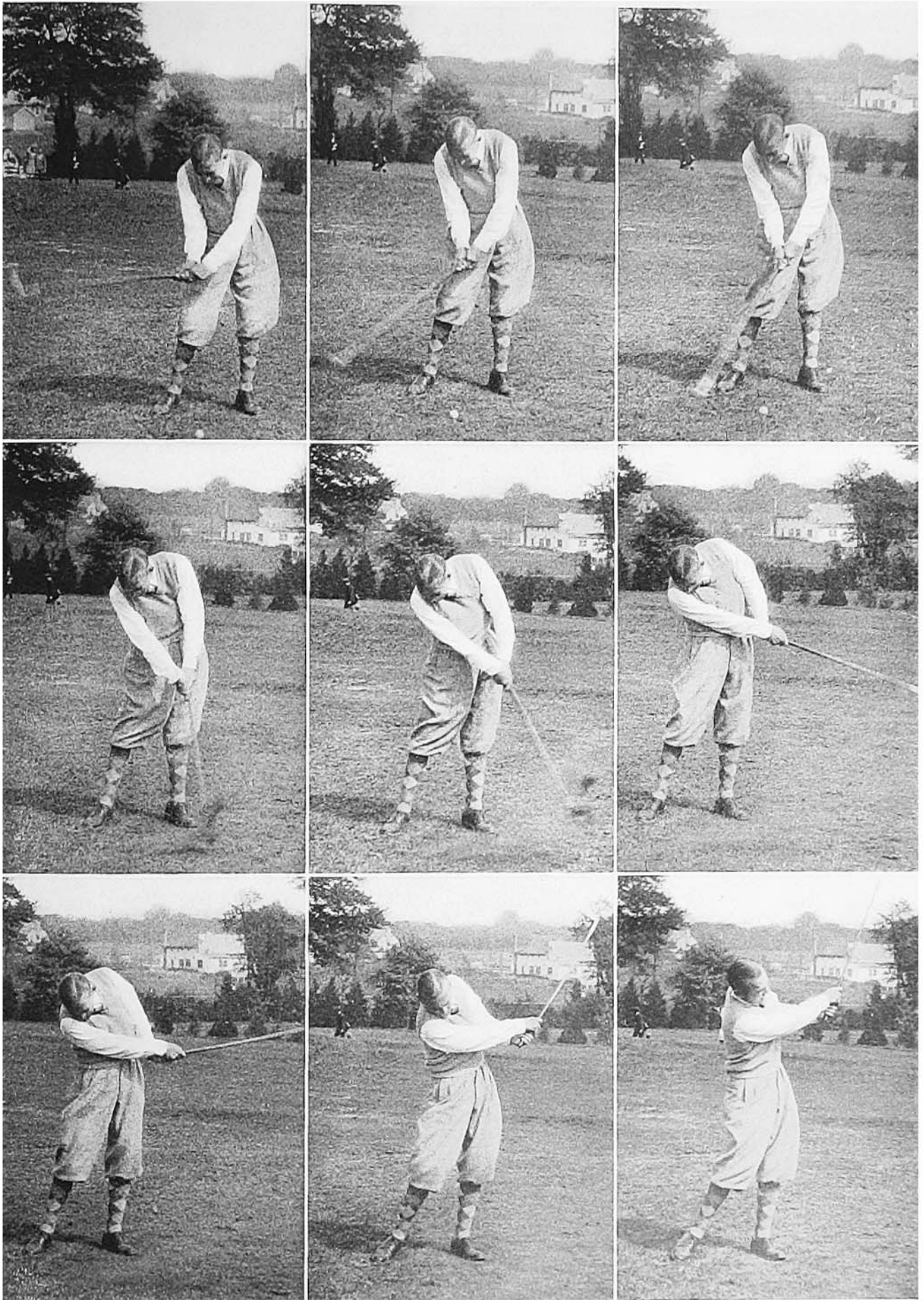
The Perfect Iron Shot

When this fine amateur player recently won the Michigan Open from a strong field of professional players, and later broke all records at the Gold Mashie, tying the 72-hole tournament record of 272, the accuracy of his iron play was considered the outstand-
