WILLIAM IRVINE HUNTER, ACCEPTS THE TROPHIES EMBLEMATIC OF HIS TITLE

The new holder of the British Amateur championship is a member of the Deal Golf Club of England and a son of Willie Hunter, who is professional at that club. He is the first son of a British professional to win the amateur championship and represents a new era in this event. The new champion is a telegrapher in the post office and outside of the championship has never been much in evidence with the exception of winning his club's championship last year. During the tournament at Hoylake he did not meet any of the American players, but made a runaway of the final match against Allan Graham of Hoylake. Hunter is a small man and uses an abbreviated style much similar to that of J. H. Taylor and J. H. Kirkwood. He plays practically all his shots with his wrists and rarely lets his club get above his shoulders in any stroke
